SUBJECT: Receive Update on Beach Bus Transit Service
AGENDA ITEM: 14

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the board of directors receive an update on the Beach Bus transit service.

DISCUSSION:

The Beach Bus transports riders between the Redding Area Bus Authority's (RABA) Downtown Transit Center and Whiskeytown National Recreation Area (WNRA) during summers. The service has operated for five summers since 2016, mostly on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend. Beach Bus services for the summers of 2018, 2019, and 2020, were cancelled due to the Carr Fire, the COVID pandemic, and subsequent administrative hurdles.

Beach Bus ridership has generally increased over time, with an eight percent increase this summer over the 2022 summer, with 978 total riders. While the service has not collected fares due to various grants being made available, staff has provided an "illustrative" fare for comparison of years. Using an illustrative fare of \$1.50 per rider, consistent with RABA's current fare structure, the farebox ratio for the Beach Bus route is shown in the table below.

The Beach Bus service will operate again in the summer of 2024 using federal rural transit funds and future operations will be considered in the 2024/25 Transit Needs Assessment.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

Friends of Whiskeytown, Inc.—a 501(c)(3) charitable organization—donates WNRA park entrance passes. RABA operates the service.

FISCAL IMPACT:

In prior seasons, Beach Bus expenditures were charged to the State Transit Assistance Reserve account in the Transportation Development Act (TDA) budget. For summer 2023 and 2024, federal rural transit COVID relief funds were approved to pay for operations by the board in the 2023/24 TDA budget. The COVID relief federal rural transit funds are apportioned to Shasta County Department of Public Works and expire in 2028.

Fiscal information is based on invoices received from RABA. For the summer seasons 2023 and 2024, RABA will invoice the county for federal rural transit funds.

Whiskeytown "Beach Bus" (Pilot Project)	No	The Beach Bus was funded in part by a grant obtained by the Friends of Whiskeytown from Dignity Health. Seasonal service began two years ago, during which time 627 passenger trips were provided during the 2016 season and 1,092 passenger trips were provided during the 2017 Season. The Friends of Whiskeytown has indicated that it will not be pursuing another grant from Dignity Health. Without supplemental grant funds, the farebox recovery ratio for last season would have been 6.54% - which is below the 10% minimum standard for non-urban routes. TDA funding is therefore not recommended.

ALTERNATIVES:

The board of directors may authorize continuation of the Whiskeytown "Beach Bus" for another year as a pilot program under the "reasonable to meet" definition.

The board of directors may modify the budget or direct staff to study other transit needs that may be reasonable to meet.

Social Services Transportation Advisory Council's (SSTAC) Chair Steve Smith gave a presentation to the board on unmet needs recommendations.

Board Member Moty stated that he would like to see the "Beach Bus" service to Whiskeytown continue and asked City of Redding Assistant Public Works Director Chuck Aukland for cost estimates. After discussion, the board was unanimous in its decision to recommend continuation of the service.

By motion made and seconded (Moty/Schreder), the staff recommendation passed unanimously with the exception of Resolution 18-06, which will be amended to show revisions for the continuation of the seasonal Whiskeytown “Beach Bus” service with a budget of \$25,000.

John Hoeflich spoke regarding the unmet transit needs assessment. Mr. Hoeflich stated that all unmet transit needs could be funded by an urban transportation service area 4 property tax.

Executive Director Dan Little addressed this issue to the board. In 1977, voters approved the Shasta County Board of Supervisors the ability to levy a property tax assessment for public transit. Dan Little consulted with SRTA's legal counsel and with the Shasta County Treasurer and discovered that the property tax assessment was not in effect because the board never voted on it and it had expired. Public hearing closed.

No vote was taken. The board directed staff to address all public comments received.

MEETING ON APRIL 28, 2020, [AGENDA ITEM #8](#)

REVIEW FISCAL YEAR 2020/21 ANNUAL TRANSIT NEEDS ASSESSMENT AND MAKE UNMET TRANSIT NEEDS FINDINGS

It is recommended that the SRTA Board of Directors:

1. Authorize the Chair to sign Resolution 20-08, finding that all current TDA-funded services and all grant-funded services, including Sunday On-Demand service and the Whiskeytown Beach Bus, are reasonable to meet; and
2. Direct staff to prepare a corresponding TDA budget for consideration at the June 23, 2020, board of directors meeting.

Impact of COVID-19 on Transit – Public transportation performance everywhere is being severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The extent of these impacts at the local level is not yet fully known; however, early data indicates a drop in ridership of at least 50% for both fixed route and

paratransit services. At the writing of this report, all RABA services except the School Express are operating. RABA has enhanced cleaning procedures, closed offices, and instituted social distancing in the form of no more than two paratransit riders per van and passenger limits on fixed route buses. Other services have likewise been impacted. CTSA service is operating with a limit of two riders at a time. Sunday on-demand transit service was suspended on April 5, 2020, for an estimated 6-8 weeks. The board of directors approved Whiskeytown Beach Bus service this summer, however, the starting date for the season may be postponed or possibly deferred to next year.

By motion made and seconded by roll call vote (Schreder/Rickert), the staff recommendation passed unanimously.

As required by TDA law, this budget funds all reasonable to meet transit services, as identified through the FY 2020/21 Unmet Transit Needs Findings approved by the board of directors at the April 2020 meeting. The budget does not include the Whiskeytown Beach Bus service which could resume in the spring of 2021. STA reserve funds could be used to restart the service with board approval. It is recommended that the board of directors authorize the Shasta County Auditor-Controller to disburse funds in accordance with FY 2020/21 Payment Instructions (Attachment B).
