DISCUSSION:

Aerial imagery is used in a variety of local and regional planning processes. Up-to-date imagery is needed to reflect the latest land use, transportation, and environmental conditions.

The board of directors authorized entering into an agreement for the *2016 Digital Orthoimagery Collection Project* with GeoTerra in February 2016. SRTA and GeoTerra began the project in early March, in partnership with all three cities, the McConnell Foundation, and the Western Shasta Resource Conservation District. Imagery of the area encompassing the three cities and adjacent portions of the unincorporated county was obtained on March 17 and 18, 2016. Elevation data was also collected on March 17. Final deliverables were received September 14, 2016, and will replace the previous imagery from 2010.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

All three cities, the McConnell Foundation, and the Western Shasta Resource Conservation District contributed funding and staff time to the project.

FINANCING:

The total cost for the imagery was \$112,200. SRTA contributed \$35,605 in Federal Planning funds and partners contributed \$76,595.
