SUBJECT:	Receive Presentation on Zero-Emission Fleet Transition Rollout Plan

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the board of directors receive a status update on SRTA's Zero-Emission Fleet Transition Rollout Plan for ShastaConnect services.

DISCUSSION:

SRTA contracts with Dignity Health Connected Living (DHCL) for specialized public transit services under the ShastaConnect brand. A state-required zero-emission bus rollout plan must be prepared and adopted by June 30, 2023. In addition, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) now requires a transit agency have a zero-emission fleet transition plan with several elements for zero-emission projects to be eligible for related federal program funds. For example, the transition plan must include how relevant technologies impact agency policies or legislation, describe the agencies relationship with utilities and alternative fuel providers, and consider workforce development needs to retain existing workers and train new workers.

SRTA contracted with Energetics to address both state and federal requirements in a Zero-Emission Fleet Transition Rollout Plan. The project team examined ShastaConnect's current fleet makeup and availability of current vehicle technologies, evaluated existing conditions and planned projects at DHCL's facility, toured RABA's facilities to determine possible opportunities for future partnerships, and reviewed currently available or planned alternative fuel sources in or near the region. The Energetics team will present the existing conditions report and next steps.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

SRTA coordinated project activities with DHCL and the Redding Area Bus Authority (RABA).

FISCAL IMPACT:

Consultant services and staff time needed to prepare the plan are budgeted using FY 2020/21 Senate Bill 1 planning formula funds in the FY 2022/23 Overall Work Program. Completion of the plan will allow SRTA to apply for federal and state funding to offset additional costs associated with transitioning the ShastaConnect fleet to zero-emission technologies.
