Q1: What is the geographical boundary of SRTA? Is it same as Shasta County?

A1: Yes, SRTA's jurisdiction is that area within the borders of Shasta County.

Q2: What is the current estimated population of SRTA's jurisdiction?

A2: Shasta County's population has been calculated to be 179,228 people by the United States Census Bureau, using data from the 2016 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates.

Q3: When does SRTA expect to award this bid?

A3: SRTA expects to award this bid prior to the end of the year.

Q4: Before we dive into the RFP process, I wanted to share with you some quick responses on all the requirements to see if you think it's worth our time to submit a formal RFP...
