SRTA is looking to fill one transportation planner position at the assistant, associate, or senior level to be part of our team of transformative professionals. THE MISSION

SRTA's mission is to maximize state, federal and other revenues for cost-effective transportation investment strategies that connect communities, people and goods.

THE AGENCY

Focusing on accessibility, equity, mobility, safety, and sustainability, SRTA studies the region's transportation needs, determines what improvements will be made, and pursues funding sources. Funds are allocated for the planning, construction, operation, and maintenance of transportation projects throughout Shasta County.

THE FACTS

- Administer over \$24 million in state and federal funds administered annually and over \$188 million in discretionary planning, capital, and operating grants received in past four years.
- Current staff of eight employees with spending determined by a seven-member elected Board of Directors.
- Located in Redding, CA in the far northern Sacramento Valley, between the Trinity Alps and the Cascades.

THE VISION

To meet the region's evolving mobility needs while avoiding traffic congestion and other growth-related pitfalls commonly experienced in larger metropolitan regions. Our efforts are intertwined with regional prosperity, environmental quality, community health and well-being, and other elements that define a great quality of life. 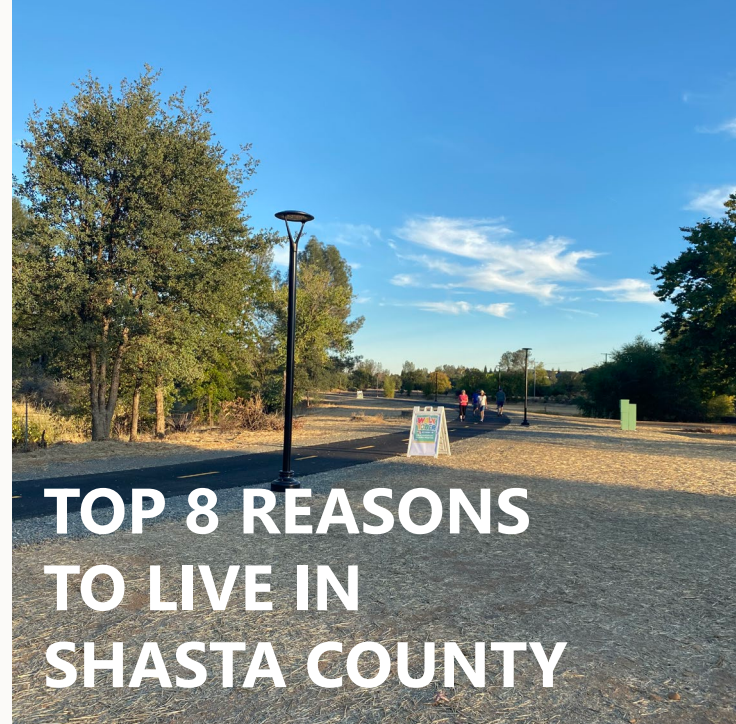
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EXAMPLES OF JOB FUNCTIONS (Illustrative only)

- Plans, organizes, and participates in a variety of routine to complex transportation plans, programs, projects, and studies.
- Conducts the research and analysis necessary to prepare technical reports, administer programs, and manage funds and resources for a variety of RTPA projects and programs.
- Prepares grant applications for funds available under various state and federal programs.
- Implements public outreach/involvement programs pursuant to RTPA procedures and environmental mandates.
- Compiles information for a variety of studies and reports; researches, analyzes, and interprets transportation, social, economic, population, and land use data and trends; develops and implements recommendations; prepares written reports on various transportation planning matters; develops, implements, and administers portions of the countywide transportation plan.
- Prepares staff reports, presentations, project information and status, and project financial information to various committees, community groups, and professional organizations about the RTPA's transportation projects and programs.
- Serves as project manager on transportation planning and development projects, which includes performing application and plan review, coordination with project applicants and agencies, background research, environmental review, preparation of public notices and staff reports, scheduling meetings and hearings, and participating in project implementation in conformance with approved plans, grant/loan requirements, conditions, and mitigation measures.
- Ensures compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and related environmental mandates.
- Participates in the development of consultant requests for proposals and qualifications for professional services; assists in the evaluation of proposals; develops and reviews contract terms and amendments; ensures contractor compliance with RTPA standards and specifications and time and budget estimates; reviews and updates deliverables; analyzes and resolves problems that may arise.

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QUALIFICATIONS (Illustrative only)

Knowledge of:

- Principles, practices, and funding sources for transportation planning and congestion management programs and projects.
- Principles and practices of program and project management.
- Principles and techniques of conducting analytical studies, evaluating alternatives, and making sound recommendations.
- Transportation planning principles, concepts, standards, and practices.
- Applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulatory codes, ordinances, and procedures relevant to assigned area of responsibility, such as the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).
- Record keeping principles and procedures.
- Techniques for effectively representing the RTPA in contacts with governmental agencies, community groups, and various business, professional, regulatory, and legislative organizations.

Ability to:

- Collect, analyze, interpret, and apply data to various transportation planning projects and present technical information and data in an effective manner.
- Perform complex technical writing and organization assignments and develop presentations.
- Interpret, apply, explain, and ensure compliance with federal, state, and local laws, codes, and regulations and RTPA policies and procedures
- Organize and prioritize a variety of projects and multiple tasks in an effective and timely manner; organize own work, set priorities, and meet critical time deadlines.
- Establish, maintain, and foster positive and effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Any combination of education and experience that would provide the required knowledge, skills, and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the required qualifications would be:

- **Assistant:** Graduation from a four-year college or university with major coursework in transportation, urban, or regional planning, transportation/traffic engineering, public or business administration, public policy, or a related field. One year of technical or paraprofessional experience in an appropriate field is desirable.
- **Associate:** Graduation requirement plus two years of professional transportation planning experience equivalent to an assistant transportation planner
- **Senior:** Graduation requirement and two years of experience equivalent to an associate transportation planner; or five years of progressively responsible experience in transportation and/or transit planning
- **Highly desirable, but not required:** American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP) credentials.



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COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

The current annual salary range for Assistant Transportation Planner is \$57,450 to \$80,850; Associate Transportation Planner is \$66,519 to \$93,642; and Senior Transportation Planner is \$88,296 to \$124,217, based on qualifications and experience.

A competitive benefits program includes:

- California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS 2% @ 55 years for classic members or 2% @ 62 years for new members as defined under PEPRA).
- Up to 9.2% employer paid 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan (social security alternative).
- Health, dental, and vision insurance, including coverage for dependents.
- Employee assistance program.
- Life/AD&D insurance; short – and long-term disability insurance.
- Leave benefits – 12 paid holidays; 2 floating holidays; up to 20 days of vacation; and 11 days of sick leave per year.
