SRTA is updating the Shasta Coordinated Transportation Plan (Coordinated Plan), which aims to improve transit services for the general public, especially transportation serving older, low income, and/or disabled individuals in Shasta County. The Coordinated Plan will identify strategies to improve people's mobility using public transit and other transportation services. SRTA is looking forward to hearing what the community thinks and is committed to improving transportation services for Shasta County residents.

What is a Coordinated Transportation Plan?

A plan that includes the input of public, private, and non-profit transportation representatives, as well as human services providers and the general public

A summary of existing transportation providers

A discussion of transit needs/ gaps within the community

A prioritized list of strategies coordinated between all types of transportation providers, which can meet the identified needs and gaps in service

Coordinated Plan strategies go beyond traditional changes to public transit service, including volunteer driver programs, interagency vehicle share, and joint marketing efforts.
