The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has completed the review of the following amendment to the Shasta Regional Transportation Agency's (SRTA) 2016/17 - 2019/20 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP):

3	State, Local and Transit Transportation Systems This amendment adds and modifies projects from the SRTA region. It includes projects with funding from the Highway Bridge Program, Highway Safety Improvement Program, Railway-Highway Crossings Program, Active Transportation Program, State Highway Operation and Protection Program, and various Federal Transit Administration (FTA) programs. 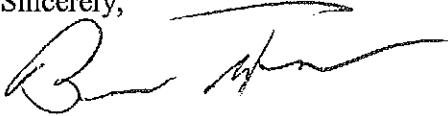
The updated programming is for projects in air quality attainment area that is exempt from the conformity determination requirement. SRTA has certified that this FTIP amendment is financially constrained, and meets the requirements of public involvement procedures per SRTA's Public Participation Plan.

Pursuant to the authority delegated to me by the Director of Caltrans, I approve SRTA's Amendment No. 3. I also recommend that the Federal Highway Administration and FTA approve this FTIP amendment for inclusion into California's 2017 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP). Approval of this amendment does not constitute an eligibility determination of project for federal funding.

Subject: Formal Amendment No. 3 to the Shasta 2017 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP)

Dear Mr. Aljabiry:

With the delegation authority provided to me by the Shasta Regional Transportation Agency (SRTA) Board of Directors per attached SRTA Resolution #13-14, dated December 10, 2013, I hereby approve Formal Amendment No. 3 to the Shasta 2017 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) for forwarding to Caltrans for review and recommendation of approval to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA).

The amendment is consistent with metropolitan transportation planning regulations per Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 450. As amended, the 2017 FTIP is financially constrained, and the attached financial summary confirms that funding is available. Additionally, the amendment is consistent with the 2015 Regional Transportation Plan. Shasta County is in conformance with federal air quality standards.

The amendment notification process complies with SRTA's adopted Public Participation Plan. The public and interagency review period from May 11, 2017, to May 25, 2017, elicited one revision to the Grouped Projects for Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities listing and met the requisite 14-day review period.

This amendment updates four grouped project listings, adds one grouped project listing, and adds an individual project listing:

Grouped Projects for Bridge Rehabilitation and Reconstruction (HBP Program) (CTIPS ID No. 211-0000-0083) – Updates existing Highway Bridge Program (HBP) projects to Caltrans, Division of Local Assistance March 29, 2017, approved revisions. The update does not include any new projects; however, there are multiple revisions to existing projects. Please refer to the grouped project listing for specific project revisions.

Grouped Projects for Safety Improvements (HSIP)(CTIPS ID No. 211-0000-0093) – Updates one Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) project, the county's Gas Point Road between Ludwig Gulch and Michael Street roadway widening, per Caltrans, HSIP March 23, 2017, list. The project federal and local shares have increased (\$370K and \$335K, respectively).

Grouped Projects for Safety Improvements – SHOPP Mandates Program (CTIPS ID No. 211-0000-0098) – Combines two State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP), Major and Minor A, projects into one listing to perform upgrade work in Shasta Lake City from 0.1 mile west of Coram Underpass to Locust Avenue.

Grouped Projects for Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities in Shasta County (CTIPS ID No. 211-0000-0115) – Adds the Middle Creek Extension bicycle and hiking trail to 2016/17. The total project cost is \$2.145M of which \$1.345M is Minor Program funding, while the residual \$0.800M is Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5320 Transit In Parks funding.

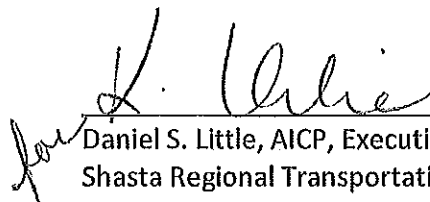
Grouped Projects for Railroad/Highway Crossing)(CTIPS ID No. 211-0000-0121) – Adds a new grouped project listing for Local Section 130 funding for two railroad/highway crossings safety improvements in the city of Redding: Girvan Road (\$10.195M) and Shasta Street (\$1.650M).

Social Services Transit (CTIPS ID No. 211-0000-0122) – Adds new individual project listing for FTA Section 5310 funding for Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and the Disabled. The 2016/17 programming reflects three distinct awards: 1) two medium-sized buses (\$140K) accommodating twelve ambulatory and two wheelchair passengers for Paratransit Services, a private company that provides contract services to the Shasta County Opportunity Center; 2) an additional one same size vehicle (\$70K) for Shasta Senior Nutrition Program, the Consolidated Transportation Services Agency for Shasta County; and 3) \$530K for three years operating assistance to Golden Umbrella for their Senior Mobility and Rural Transportation Volunteer Driver Program.

With this transmittal, Shasta 2017 FTIP Formal Amendment No. 3 is being provided directly to Caltrans. An electronic copy will be transmitted by email to Caltrans, FHWA, and FTA. The approved amendment will be posted to the SRTA website at <http://www.srta.ca.gov>. Please recommend this formal amendment for federal approval.
